the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally WHEREAS, recognized Indian government and a treaty recognized by the laws of the United States, and

the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body WHEREAS, of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the WHEREAS. authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

Congress by enactment of P.L. 93-638 provided a mechanism WHEREAS. for Indian Tribes to exercise the right of SELF-DETERMINATION; and

the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act WHEREAS, (ISTEA) of 1991, Public Law 102-240, has provided funding to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the purpose of Transportation Planning on the Indian Reservations, and

the Oneida Tribe of Indians has the expertise required to WHEREAS, successfully administer the required transportation planning on the Oneida Reservation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be advised that the Oneida Tribe of Indians desires to contract, under the provisions of Public Law 93-638, its "Fair Share" portion of the available Transportation Planning funding for the purpose of expanding and coordinating the Transportation Plan for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians hereby authorizes its Chairwoman, Deborah J. Doxtator, to enter into negotiations with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the above stated purpose.
