RESOLUTION NO. 4-12-06-O

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Lawrence J. Brenwall and Sandra A. Brenwall Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See attached.
Tax Parcel Numbers: HB-1309, HB-1320, HB-1323 combined into HB-1323
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential land use, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

A parcel of land located in part of Indian Claim 147 and in part of Indian Claim 152, Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin described as follows:

Commencing at a Brown County Monument marking the Northwesterly corner of Indian Claim 151, thence South $36^{\circ}11'35''$ West 431.16 feet; thence North $58^{\circ}54'40''$ West 854.13 feet to the point of beginning; thence South $30^{\circ}36'40''$ West 633.93 feet; thence South $59^{\circ}23'20''$ East 393.00 feet; thence South $46^{\circ}57'35''$ West 34.39 feet; thence North $59^{\circ}23'20''$ West 371.36 feet; thence South $29^{\circ}52'00''$ West 321.74 feet; thence South $29^{\circ}53'14''$ West 83.20 feet; thence North $59^{\circ}05'28''$ West 228.40 feet; thence North $59^{\circ}02'36''$ West 120.10 feet; thence South $31^{\circ}00'00''$ West 200.41 feet; thence 33.82 feet along the arc of a 768.51 foot radius curve to the right, the chord of which bears North $60^{\circ}30'55''$ West 33.82 feet; thence North $59^{\circ}15'16''$ West 204.02 feet to a point which is South $59^{\circ}15'16''$ East 20 feet, more or less from the water's edge of Duck Creek; thence along a meander line of Duck Creek North $60^{\circ}14'06''$ East 231.62; thence North $35^{\circ}52'17''$ East 202.19 feet; thence North $30^{\circ}45'27''$ East 200.91 feet; thence North $49^{\circ}02'40''$ East 70.64 feet; thence North $19^{\circ}27'28''$ East 317.77 feet; thence North $17^{\circ}07'21''$ East 301.01 feet to a point which is South $58^{\circ}54'40''$ East 34 feet, more or less from the water's edge of Duck Creek and the end of meander line; thence South $58^{\circ}54'40''$ East 546.32 feet to the point of beginning and subject to easements and reservations of record, and including those lands lying between the meander line and Duck Creek.

Parcel 2 - A parcel of land located in part of Indian Claim 152, Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin described as follows:

Commencing at a Brown County Monument marking the Northwesterly corner of Indian Claim 151, thence $S36^{\circ}11'35''$ W 431.16 feet; thence $N58^{\circ}54'40''$ W 854.13 feet; thence $S30^{\circ}36'40''$ W 633.93 feet; thence $S10^{\circ}41'21''$ W 35.10 feet to the point of beginning; thence $S29^{\circ}52'00''$ W 115.66 feet; thence $S59^{\circ}16'20''$ E 116.36 feet; thence $N29^{\circ}52'00''$ E 115.90 feet; thence $N59^{\circ}23'20''$ W 116.36 feet to the point of beginning containing 13,471 square feet, more or less.
