### RESOLUTION NO. 4-26-06-D

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:  
Former Ronald Peterson and Linda M. Peterson Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:  
Legal Description: See attached.  
Tax Parcel Number: HB-1327-5
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential land use and will not be used for gaming purposes, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

A parcel of land located in part of Indian Claim 153, Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin. Parcel described in J 18286 I 47 and more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the Southeasterly Right of Way Line of the Green Bay and Western Railroad Company and the Northerly Line of Claim 153, thence South  $62^{\circ} 52' 00''$  East along said Northerly Line 672.50 feet; thence South  $30^{\circ} 56' 32''$  West 579.71 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence South  $30^{\circ} 40' 32''$  West 308.78 feet to the Southerly Line of Indian Claim 153 and the center line of County Trunk Highway "J" and West Service Road; thence North  $59^{\circ} 11' 00''$  West along said Southerly Claim Line and said Center Line 260.91 feet; thence North  $30^{\circ} 45' 03''$  East 125.02 feet; thence South  $59^{\circ} 11' 00''$  West 112.89 feet; thence North  $30^{\circ} 45' 03''$  East 278.32 feet; thence South  $56^{\circ} 12' 03''$  East 373.92 feet to the Point of Beginning except those lands now being used for highway purposes and subject to easements and reservations of record. Parcel contains 104,877 square feet (2.4 acres), more or less.
