- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Samuel J. Vainisi Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See attached.
Tax Parcel Numbers: HB-1427-10, HB-1427-13
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a vacant land and will not be used for gaming purposes, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

Lots One (1) and Four (4), Volume 30 Certified Survey Maps, Page 262, said map being part of Indian Claims 200 and 202, Section 26, Township 24 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin.

Parcel II:

Part of Indian Claims 200 and 202, Section 26, Township 24 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Indian Claim 200; thence North $0^{\circ}54'36''$ West, 91.64 feet along the East right-of-way of Hidden Trail; thence 18.69 feet along the South line of Lot 4, Volume 30, Certified Survey Maps, page 262, Brown County Records, being the arc of a 12.00 foot radius curve to the left whose long chord bears South $45^{\circ}31'25.5''$ East, 16.86 feet; thence North $89^{\circ}51'45''$ East, 195.57 feet along said South line; thence 45.06 feet along said South line being the arc of a 65.00 foot radius curve to the left whose long chord bears North $70^{\circ}00'18''$ East, 44.16 feet; thence 44.18 feet along said South line being the arc of a 65.00 foot radius curve to the right whose long chord bears North $69^{\circ}37'08''$ East, 43.33 feet; thence North $0^{\circ}54'36''$ West, 170.00 feet along the East line of said Lot 4; thence North $89^{\circ}51'44''$ East, 491.97 feet along the South line of the recorded Plat of "Hidden Trails"; thence South $0^{\circ}08'16''$ East, 279.78 feet to the Northeast corner of Indian Claim 200; thence South $89^{\circ}51'45''$ West, 289.78 feet; thence South $0^{\circ}22'50''$ East, 65.00 feet, thence South $43^{\circ}27'51''$ West, 243.13 feet; thence South $89^{\circ}37'11''$ West, 320.00 feet to the Easterly right-of-way of Hidden Trail; thence North $0^{\circ}22'50''$ West, 242.42 feet along said right-of-way to the point of beginning.
