
Resolution Adopting Additional Sections 9 through 14 to the Indian Preference Law

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, an Indian Preference Law, now codified in Chapter 57, Oneida Code of Laws (OCL), sections 1 through 8, was adopted by Business Committee Resolution BC-7-27-98-A; and
- WHEREAS, said Law addresses the rules and procedures for certification of those individuals and businesses entitled to the benefits of Indian preference in contracting and employment; and
- WHEREAS, it is desirable to provide for the implementation of Indian Preference by defining the rights and responsibilities of such individuals and businesses, the priority of preference between various classes entitled to the preference, the benefits in the form of bidding allowances or discounts, the procedures for implementing the preference and enforcing its terms.
- WHEREAS, an Addendum containing sections 9 through 14 specifically addresses such subjects.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the aforesaid sections 9 through 14, the text of which is herein attached, are hereby added to and made part of the Indian Preference Law codified in Chapter 57, OCL.
