
Resolution # 4-17-02-B Innovations in American Government Grant

- WHEREAS,** The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** It is the intent of the Division of Land Management to reacquire all land located within the original 1838 Oneida Indian Reservation boundaries of Wisconsin, and to preserve, maintain, and distribute such lands according to the needs of our people, and
- WHEREAS,** It is the Mission of the Finance Department to provide assistance to Tribal members in obtaining financing through our loan programs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application, on behalf of the Oneida Division of Land Management, to the Institute for Government Innovation at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University to expand home financing services to the Oneida membership.
