WHEREAS. the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section WHEREAS. of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS. the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

the Oneida Tribe established the Oneida Police Department to "provide enhanced law WHEREAS, enforcement and security on the Oneida Reservation by protecting our nation's residents, employees, and patrons through the enforcement of rules and regulations for the welfare and safety of the community", and

the Oneida Tribe encourages collaborative efforts between the Oneida Police Department WHEREAS, and the Outagamie County Sheriff's Department as well as other law enforcement agencies, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application to the State of Wisconsin/Department of Justice for the CY 2004 County Tribal Law Enforcement grant.
